Corp!: What one word describes Richard Baron?

Baron: Interested.

Corp!: What drives you professionally? **Baron:** Trying to do the very best for clients.

Baron: Stanford Ovshinsky [president, chief scientist and technologist] at Energy Conversion Devices. They've been in the news for a number

of years, doing cutting edge stuff. He seems to be a visionary.

Corp!: What's one of your pet peeves and why? **Baron:** People spending too much time e-mailing and not enough time talking to people faceto-face.

Corp!: The best advice you can give someone

Baron: Follow your heart.
